

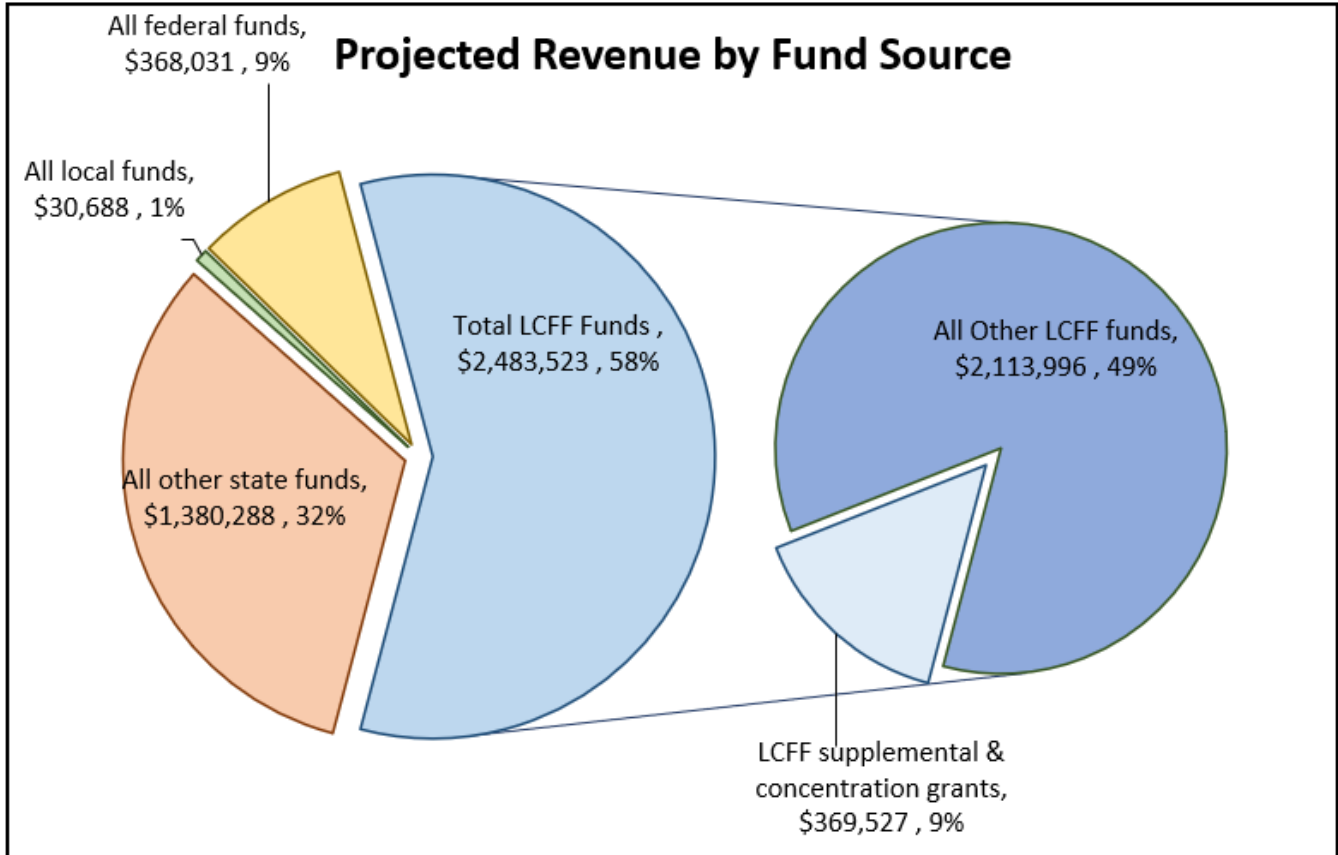

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

### Budget Overview for the 2024-25 School Year

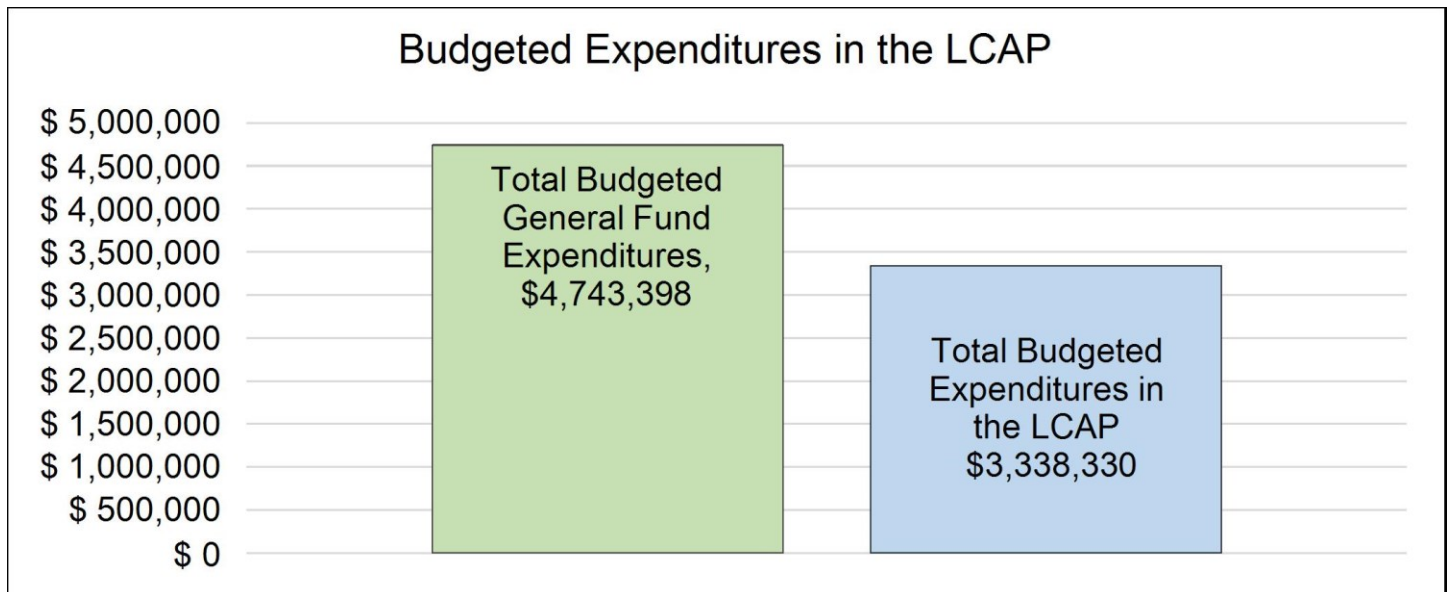


This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Downtown College Preparatory Middle expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for Downtown College Preparatory Middle is \$4,262,530, of which \$2483523 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$1380288 is other state funds, \$30688 is local funds, and \$368031 is federal funds. Of the \$2483523 in LCFF Funds, \$369527 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

The LCFF gives school districts more flexibility in deciding how to use state funds. In exchange, school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) that shows how they will use these funds to serve students.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Downtown College Preparatory Middle plans to spend for 2024-25. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

The text description of the above chart is as follows: Downtown College Preparatory Middle plans to spend \$4743398 for the 2024-25 school year. Of that amount, \$3338330 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$1,405,068 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following:

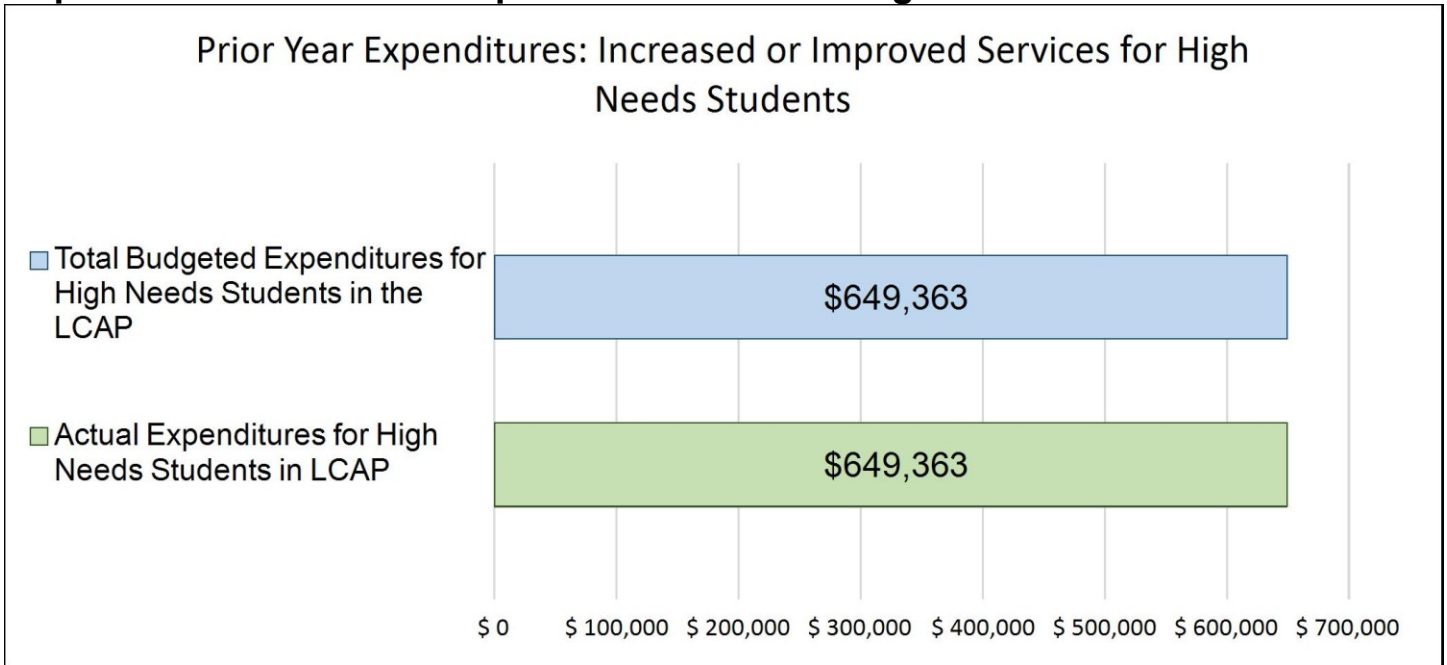
DCP El Camino Middle School plans to spend \$4,743,398 for the 2024-25 school year. Of that amount, \$3,338,330 is tied to actions/services within the LCAP, and \$1,405,068 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following: Classified staff salaries & benefits, facility-related costs including utilities rent, and maintenance, contracted services and supplies required to operate the school.

### Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2024-25 School Year

In 2024-25, Downtown College Preparatory Middle is projecting it will receive \$369527 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Downtown College Preparatory Middle must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the LCAP. Downtown College Preparatory Middle plans to spend \$3338330 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the LCAP.
