

Expanded Learning Opportunity Program (ELO-P)

- “ELO-P provides funding for afterschool and summer school enrichment programs for transitional kindergarten through sixth grade. “Expanded learning” means before school, after school, summer, or intersession learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of pupils through hands-on, engaging learning experiences. “
- ***“It is the intent of the Legislature that expanded learning programs are pupil-centered, results driven, include community partners, and complement, but do not replicate, learning activities in the regular schoolday and school year.”***

Expanded Learning Opportunity (ELO-P) Grant & Plan

Note: DCP Middle Schools have existing afterschool programs funded by the ASES grant. The grant costs have exceeded the ASES funding in the last couple years due to higher labor costs for our provider. As such, part of the ELO-P funding is used to pay for the ASES grant shortfall. We currently partner with the Boys & Girls Club for the ASES program.

Will funding continue at these levels after this year?



ELO-P Allowable Uses & Requirements

- The ELO Program funding can be used for the local match for ASES, as it is the intent that ASES, 21st CCLC Elementary/Middle School, and the ELO Program funding be considered a single comprehensive program.
- ELO Programs are operated either before school, after school, before and after school, and not during the school day.
- Can be used to provide program access for pupils at off-site locations. In doing so, LEAs must ensure that all transportation requirements are met.
- LEAs that receive an ELO Program apportionment must operate an ELO Program for a minimum of 30 nonschooldays, which may include ESY days provided pursuant to EC Section 56345(b)(3), for no less than 9 hours per day. EC Section 46120(b)(1)(B).
- LEAs must have their program plan approved by the governing board in a public meeting and post it on the LEA's website
