

R492, Honorary Degrees¹

R492-1 Purpose: To provide guidelines for Utah System of Higher Education ("USHE") degree-granting institutions to award honorary degrees.

R492-3 Policy

- **3.1 Purposes of Honorary Degrees:** The purpose of honorary degrees includes:
 - **3.1.1** Recognizing a recipient who has achieved excellence and has made substantial contributions to their professional field, higher education in general, or to a specific educational institution;
 - **3.1.2** Bringing distinction to both the recipient and the institution; and/or
 - **3.1.3** Rewarding past donations and/or developing future donation opportunities (usually combined with the purposes in subsections 3.1.1 and 3.1.2).
- **3.2 Awarding Honorary Degrees:** USHE degree-granting institutions may award honorary degrees. USHE institutional boards of trustees are responsible for selecting honorary degree recipient(s). Technical colleges, as defined in Utah Code section 53B-2a-105, do not award honorary degrees.
- **3.3 Reporting Requirements**: USHE degree-granting institutions shall report anticipated honorary degree recipients to the Commissioner annually by May 1.
