Identified by Internal Audit By Dean Dorton

☐ Challenges in securing doors and controlling access via mechanical keys.
☐ Security camera systems have limitations in their effectiveness.
☐ Security and Safety projects are not given priority.
☐ Insufficient funding for critical safety and security projects.
☐ Additional Safety and Security Personnel needed.
☐ Training programs for safety and security need to be more frequent.
☐ Need to improve documentation of Continuing Education for safety and security personnel.
☐ Enhance crisis preparedness and ensure a consistent, effective response across all institutions, it is recommended that each college establish a dedicated crisis management team.
☐ Technology enables the college to provide emergency responders with precise, real-time information about the exact location of an emergency on campus.
☐ restricted access to Centurion Solutions' expertise has led to an inequitable distribution of security resources among the colleges.
☐ It was noted that the System currently has a small team dedicated to security matters, which may not be sufficient to address the diverse and complex security needs of all the locations.

Response to Audit

Inventory of existing safety systems: cameras, door access, detection systems, staffing.

Physical evaluations to identify deficiencies in safety coverages.

Research new technologies to be integrated into the safety and security system.

Develop system-wide safety and security master plan to identify pathways forward.

Seek funding sources to implement master plan.

- ☐ Remove visualization of real-time situations from remote locations.
- ☐ Ability to provide status and information to 3rd party responders.
- ☐ Ability to provide informative information to internal and 3rd party responders.
- ☐ Al Technology analysis in real-time.
- ☐ Al Technology informational data to security and law enforcement.

Leveraging AI technologies to enhance campus security where it can supplement or replace the need for security services or staffing.

Explore long-term partnerships and agreements with local law enforcement and first responders.

Explore market opportunities for security services that can enhance campus security efforts of KCTCS.

Explore reoccurring funding for in-house staffing of campus security of KCTCS where security services cannot be contracted.

Security Personnel staffing is the hardest nut to crack. There is not one solution that fits all situations.
