Dear Student Pharmacist Colleagues,

We have been informed that university leadership is considering increasing tuition for PharmD students for the 2025-26 academic year by 3.4%. This proposed tuition increase aligns with graduate and undergraduate tuition adjustments, which have already been approved by the Board of Regents. The Board of Regents reviewed the PharmD tuition proposal at their meeting last week, and they are scheduled to vote on it at their next meeting on March 6-7, 2025.

Here is a breakdown of the proposed tuition increase for PharmD students:

Current Semester Tuition:	\$12,439
Proposed Semester Tuition:	\$12,862
Increase Per Semester:	\$423

University leadership and the Board of Regents would like to receive your input on this proposed tuition increase and any suggestions you may have regarding measures the university can take to provide support and resources for those impacted by this change. We will compile your feedback and share it with the Board of Regents before they make their decision on the university's request to increase your tuition.
