OPERATING BUDGET UPDATE

- State's fiscal condition largely unchanged, but with bigger federal headwinds
- House/Senate operating budget proposals include \$11.8M- \$16.1M in biennial reductions for WSU
- Reductions to the Washington College Grant, authority for 5% FY27 tuition bump on the table
- House/Senate proposals reduce the state's share of compensation enhancements

NOT FUNDED IN HOUSE OR SENATE:

FUNDED IN BOTH HOUSE AND SENATE:

- Academic Student Employee Contract
- Medical School Accreditation

Native Cougs Scholars Program

CAPITAL BUDGET UPDATE

- House/Senate proposals de-prioritize higher education in favor of affordable housing, environmental causes, behavioral health, and early learning
- Minor works budgets mostly funded in both proposals, especially for preservation

WSU Projects:

- Demolition of Heald Hall and design of replacement funded in both budgets
- Spokane Team Health Education funded at \$37M in House
- Wenatchee plant growth facility funded in both proposals
- WADDL Puyallup design, Vancouver chiller both funded in one proposal each



Federal Update – Administration & Agencies

Agency Decisions Impacting WSU:

DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY

• Energy-related research cut (15% rate on F&A reimbursements)

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

 Working with stakeholders and Congressional offices to address paused grants

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

 Any major changes must come from Congress

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES

- Reorganization: Administration for a Healthy America (AHA)
- Workforce Reductions (approx. 25%):

OTHER AGENCY IMPACTS:

- Student Visas
 - Two students impacted by F-1 visa revocation
 - WSU International Programs supports 209 international scholars and 1,201 international students
- Executive Orders
 - A total of **116 executive orders** to date!

FY 2026 Federal Funding Process

Earmarks and funding supporting WSU strategic projects moving forward for FY 2026

- Approved almost \$41 Million of requests for submittal in earmarks:
 - Hot Cell Construction; Aquaculture Program; Supporting Semiconductor Research; and V&E Program

Continued request for funding for WSU strategic priorities:

DOT: **Aviation Biofuels**

USDA: Agriculture Research; Precision Agriculture; Resilient Livestock Initiative; Herbicide Resistance

DOD Research: Cyber Security; Advanced Materials; Reactive Materials supporting ISP/ARA partnership

DOE: Nuclear Sciences, Hydrogen; Grid Security

Education: PELL Grants; Trio Programs
