The Child and Family Research Unit (CAFRU) has been in existence for nearly 25 years supporting underserved children, families and communities; after over 2 decades of experience, lessons and evolution of our mission, our goals and scope have now grown to the point that elevation to Center status will be beneficial to our work and the University more broadly. This Center would create an enormous opportunity to support Faculty, staff, and students within the College and across Colleges/Departments to supplement our current community-based in-service efforts with pre-service training and curriculum to better educate our workforce on the importance of trauma-informed principles, practices, and mental health and well-being of students and staff. Building off existing partnerships, we will increase capacity across the College and the University in a way that hasn't occurred before to come together for focused work. This Center will help support translation to the broader public and communities which adds value to the work being conducted inside our system(s). The Collective Trauma of the pandemic has taken an exceptional toll on the stress levels, mental health, coping skills, and anxiety of students AND educators. If we do not act swiftly, we will be losing the opportunity to support the next generation of our workforce; we risk losing skilled professionals to burnout; and we will continue to see increased rates of Mental Health issues in both children and adults, including Depression, Anxiety, Substance abuse issues, and suicide. This work is occurring but in bits and pieces and inconsistently, leading to dilution of impact. There is a critical need to reduce silos and create a central, coordinated effort to mitigate the impacts of traumatic stress on our current and future workforce to improve the long-term mental health and resilience of our communities.

In terms of Organizational flow, the initial plan is for the Center to remain under the current structure, which has my direct report to Vicki McKracken as Dean of Extension and reporting up to Dean Powers in CAHNRS, with an affiliation to Health Sciences. As for the administrative costs, Extension covers an ADR for myself, which is the only non-grant funding we have. While I would love to consider the ability to secure State funds in the future, right now we will continue to use grant funds to support the work. I have been with the Unit since 2005 on 100% grant funding, along with all our staff, and we are fully funded through 2026 with current awards; we also have a number of proposals we are looking to submit in spring/summer that will provide opportunities for potential growth. At some juncture in the future I would be hopeful for PBL for the Center, but with the current financial situation and budget reductions I feel it is best that we rely on grant funding for support. I have secured over \$6M in grant funding for the Unit since I became Director in 2020, and I believe that Center status will only increase our opportunities to develop collaborative proposals with Faculty across the Colleges that will makes us more competitive.
