SUBJECT: Proposed Revisions to the Washington Administrative Code (WAC)
Chapter 504-04 – Practice and Procedure.

PROPOSED: That the Board of Regents approve proposed revisions to the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) Chapter 504-04 – Practice and Procedure.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION: WSU conducts formal adjudicative proceedings in accordance with the Washington Administrative Procedure Act, RCW Chapter 34.04, in a number of different settings, including certain student disciplinary proceedings and certain faculty disciplinary proceedings.

Currently, WSU's student conduct regulations allow attorneys, including licensed legal interns, to represent students in conduct board hearings if they are licensed to practice law in any state. WAC 504-26-020 (Advisors and representatives). However, WSU's generally applicable regulations regarding practice and procedure require attorneys to be licensed in Washington state in order to act as representatives in formal adjudicative proceedings. WAC 504-04-130 (Advising and representation of parties).

The purpose of the proposed amendment, which was recommended by the Attorney General's Office, is to remove the requirement of Washington licensure from WAC 504-04-130 so that the two regulations are consistent.
