Changes made to definitions on organizational rules. Specifically, 102.01 with regards to definition of apprentice. There were some other statutes that were repealed so edits were made to clean that up. The make up of the Board was update. 29CFR was updated in 2022 but the rules had the last effective date to be 2020. Board has approved updating 101.02 to the newest version of CFR29.

Attorney Eaton: SB188 passed with 2 amendments. Attorney Eaton thinks that it tightens things up regarding what independent inspectors can do within scope of their license. Independent providers will be submitting a certificate to the local authority. Attorney Eaton will be sending link for SB188

VII. OPLC Updates

A. Licensure by endorsement

Counsel is still waiting for Board to help with plumbing jurisdictions those that are substantially similar. The Board was also notified that separate work groups are not permitted

VIII. Public Comments

- A. William Hitchcock: Application was granted based on them taking the exam during the February meeting. Mr. Hitchcock wanted to discuss reciprocity and how it is accepted. He states that he comes from a very strict state regarding licenses. Holds Master and Journeyman license in MA and holds Master and Gas Fitter license in ME. Wants to know why he must take the 2 in NH. Feels that there is not much difference between the states. MH asked whether an applicant from NH would need to take ME and MA test to get license. Mr. Hitchcock believes MA is very strict and more so than NH. JN stated that way laws/rules are written is that to reciprocate, it must be identical coding between states. The Mechanical Safety & Licensing Board is governed by that. Mr. Hitchcock questions whether homeowners can pull permits to do work at their residence. JN stated that is managed town by town. Mr. Hitchcock who does inspections where JN responded that it depends on who is doing the inspections for towns.
- **B. Gary Gauthier:** As a trainer, he feels he still needs direction for CE Broker. As the train the trainer he is getting mixed messages. He is assuming a certificate of completion was supposed to be handed him, to upload to CE Broker. He has reached out to CE Broker to get clarification. Wants to have a meeting with CE Broker and OPLC to get things clarified. Mr. Gauthier is looking for direction on this. Attorney Eaton suggested reaching out to Heather and Bethany or speak to Dee when she is in.
- **C. Ted Evans:** Would like to reiterate the discomfort with CE Broker. He still feels it is unclear the position of the Provider and CE Broker. He still feels there is a lot of confusion regarding CE Broker. He has reached to CE Broker and doesn't feel he is getting answers
- **D. Charles Clark**: Attended last month and said that there was a meeting coming up with all providers. **JD** said the request was made to OPLC and it is in their court. Mr. Clark asked what the advantage of CE Broker for Plumbers. **JN** stated that the decision was not the Board's decision.
