#### 5.13. Information Technology Administration

## Part 1. Policy Statement.

It is the policy of tThe Board of Trustees, in accordance with the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities system's mission, to provides appropriate information technology access to disseminate and extend knowledge, to foster the free exchange of ideas, and to provide effective support for its teaching, research, administrative, and public service functions. Appropriate access will beis afforded to information technology resources, including but not limited to computers, software, e-mail accounts, internet access, and similar computing tools, that allows students, faculty, and staff to undertake their respective college- or university-related activities. for students, faculty, and staff for fulfilling the missions, and for appropriate related activities.

#### Part 2. Responsibilities

The chancellor shall develop an information technology strategic <u>frameworkplan</u> for approval by the <u>Bb</u>oard and prescribe data, applications, security, and technology <u>standards</u> <u>procedures and operating instructions in order</u> to ensure the <u>accessibility</u>, effectiveness, efficiency, timeliness, <u>security</u>, <u>availability</u>, and accuracy of information gathered, stored, and utilized by the system office, colleges, and universities. Each college and university shall ensure that the information technology <u>planning</u> components of its strategic plan are aligned with <u>the systemMinnesota State information technology framework planning goals</u>.

Each college and university shall may adopt a <u>additional local</u>, campus level policiesy and procedures on <u>information technology use</u> computer and network system use and security in alignment with board <u>policies</u>, system procedures, and operating instructions.

#### Part 3. Accountability/Reporting

The chancellor <u>shall</u> periodically <u>shall</u> provide an update to the <u>boardBoard</u> on the implementation of the <u>systemMinnesota State</u> information technology strategic <u>frameworkplan</u>.

#### Part 1. Policy Statement

The Board of Trustees, in accordance with the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities mission, provides appropriate information technology access to support teaching, research, administrative, and public service functions. Appropriate access is afforded to information technology resources, including but not limited to computers, software, e-mail accounts, internet access, and similar computing tools that allows students, faculty, and staff to undertake their respective college- or university-related activities.

#### Part 2. Responsibilities

The chancellor shall develop an information technology strategic framework for approval by the board and prescribe data, applications, security, and technology procedures and operating instructions to ensure the accessibility, effectiveness, efficiency, timeliness, security, availability, and accuracy of information gathered, stored, and utilized by the system office, colleges, and universities. Each college and university shall ensure that the information technology components of its strategic plan are aligned with the Minnesota State information technology framework.

Each college and university may adopt additional local, campus level policies and procedures on information technology use in alignment with board policies, system procedures, and operating instructions.

#### Part 3. Accountability/Reporting

The chancellor shall periodically provide an update to the board on the implementation of the Minnesota State information technology strategic framework.
