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# **Purpose**


- Inform key college and university staff about the 2024 capital program request
- Share legislative bonding tour information and best practices
- Seek feedback on how system office staff can help colleges and universities make bonding visits successful



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### **Capital Bonding 101 in Minnesota**

- State of Minnesota sells General Obligation (GO) bonds to pay for capital improvement projects
- Projects must be:
  - Public purpose, publicly owned
  - · Capital in nature
  - · Specified in law
- Requires three-fifths vote in Legislature
  - House = 81 of 134 members
  - Senate = 41 of 67 members
- Under some circumstances, state General Fund revenues may by used for capital investments
  - · Does not require three-fifths votes like GO bonds
- Traditionally during even-year legislative session
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- Not uncommon to occur in odd-year legislative sessions

## **Capital Bonding 101 – Minnesota State**

- For Minnesota State, bonding funds academic facilities projects and real estate transactions
  - Asset preservation: Higher Education Asset Preservation and Replacement (HEAPR)
  - Line items: Major capital projects, real estate transactions
- Minnesota State debt responsibility:
  - · HEAPR: Zero, fully financed by the state
  - · Line-items: One-third debt
    - Shared equally between gaining institution and system as a whole




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



# **2023 Program Funding**

### **Implications**


#### **Asset Preservation – HEAPR**

- \$44.7 million \$26% of the requested amount
- Under funding continues:
  - Average funding \$42 million (31%) over last 5 biennium
- Backlog of maintenance now \$1.4 billion

### Major Projects - \$409 million in future needs

- \$259 million to complete funded design work
- \$150 million to address unfunded projects



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### **Bonding Tour Planning**

- · Communicate with your local legislators
  - Invite them to be part of the tour/presentation
- Develop itinerary
  - Include students, faculty and staff & community/industry partners
  - Include welcome & restroom break(s) opportunities
  - President or appointed campus rep serve as MC
  - · Flexibility:
    - 'Walk see' vs 'Sit listen'
    - Other topics: enrollment, tuition, graduation rates, budgets, sustainability
    - · Other community projects
    - Weather & traffic is a factor might arrive early or late try to keep them on track regardless of arrival time
- Develop handouts
  - Highlight HEAPR needs
- Dry Run
  - · Timing, walking route, and talking
  - Technology
  - Keys (make sure all rooms are open)
- Meal/Food
- Identify Parking:
  - Bus (drop off/ pick up location and parking)
  - Personal vehicles: 5-8 reserved spots



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### **Bonding Tour Communication**

What we will provide you:

- Date / Time
- · Specific instructions, if any, regarding what they want to see
- Meal/food request
- · Dietary restrictions if serving a meal
- Number of participants (names if possible)
- System Office attendees
- Local presenters, if any, and contact information

What we need from you (to provide committee):

- Campus contact information
- · Bus drop off location
- Map & campus address
- Bus greeter names (if known)
- Bus parking location
- Car parking reserve 5-8 parking spots
- Room # for local presenters reach out to local presenters and confirm technology needs, provide parking information and room location



### **Bonding Visit 'Day of'**

- Bus arrives Greet committee members at bus be waiting outside
  - System office staff will assist with catching up those that drive separately
- Offer a restroom break opportunity
- Start tour right away (we will let you know if they want to eat/hold presentations first

   typically the visit will start with a tour already on their feet)
- After tour, head to designated room for meal & presentations
- Local presenters should be waiting in the room any handouts should already be at tables
- As committee gets settled, officially welcome them, local legislator can welcome them to the district
- Once meal has been served, campus president and others begin brief 5-minute presentation about project; recap what they just saw
  - Include HEAPR needs
- Campus president or designee will act as MC when done with presentation, turn it over to the local presenters
- At the end, provide brief closing remarks, thank them for coming and walk them to the bus
  - With about 20 minutes remaining, the bus driver will get bus and bring it to pickup location

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## **Bonding Visit Reminders**

- Retouch planning:
  - · Walk route, clean areas
  - Signage
  - Keys/availability
  - Technology
  - Meal/Snacks/Drinks
- Greet bus
  - · Restroom stop opportunity
- · Bus driver
  - Include bus driver in the meal, guide them to parking spot
- Have campus reps at the front, middle and end of tour group to respond to questions
- Any handouts should be at the tables ahead of time
- · Be flexible
- · System office staff will assist with anything needed
- Campus will act as MC/host do not "leave" visit when local presenters are speaking
- · Walk legislators to the bus when over and thank them for visiting
  - Get committee back on the road 'on time'
- Any follow-up

- Total cost of project (coordinate with Michelle Gerner)
- Amount of State Capital Request (coordinate with Michelle Gerner)
- Any matching or partner funds
- Has project received capital investment dollars in prior years?
  - If so, provide details
- Year request first submitted: session and bill number/author if applicable
  - · Government relations can help if needed
- Can the project be phased?
- Scope of the project: site acquisition, predesign, design, construction, etc.
