### **EO 22-98 Attachment A - Essential and Critical Infrastructure Workers**

The City of Saint Paul (City) recognizes the following persons as essential and critical infrastructure workers for the purpose of City emergency ordinances regarding mitigation/protective measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 on Saint Paul Island:

- (a) Persons engaged in public safety, which includes emergency management, emergency dispatch, law enforcement, corrections, probation, court system, Office of Children's Services/tribal child welfare personnel acting in an official capacity, Public agencies responding to abuse and neglect of children, elders, and vulnerable adults, and Department of Defense Personnel returning from temporary duty or engaging in mission essential travel.
- (b) Essential Government Services Personnel needed to ensure the continuing operations of government agencies to provide for the health, safety, and welfare of the public.
- (c) Persons engaged in subsistence fishing and the commercial fishing industry including fishermen, processors and transporters of fish and those providing contract services to fishermen, processors and transporters related to maintenance and operation of commercial fishing vessels and processing facilities.
- (d) Persons engaged in scientific research on Saint Paul Island, such as but not limited to marine mammal, bird, fish, oceanic research activities.
- (e) Persons engaged in education, which shall be limited to instructional staff and administrative support staff.
- (f) Persons engaged in news media or news industry such as media that focus on delivering news to the general public, which includes print media (newspapers, newsmagazines), broadcast news (radio and television), and the Internet (online newspapers, news blogs, news videos, live news streaming, etc.).
- (g) Persons employed in the following categories:
  - (1) Healthcare Operations and Public Health;
  - (2) Public Works, including water, sewer, gas, electrical, roads and highways, public transportation, and solid waste collection and removal;
  - (3) Technology/Communications;
  - (4) Tourism industry;
  - (5) Essential construction and facilities maintenance;
  - (6) Critical manufacturing;
  - (7) Food and agriculture;
  - (8) Home emergency and safety;

- (9) Utility operations and maintenance (whether public or private);
- (10) Transportation/Logistics;
- (11) Plumbers, electricians, mechanics and other service providers who provide services that are necessary to maintain the safety, sanitation and essential operation of residences, transportation, and commercial fishing infrastructure;
- (12) Supply of fuel (including heating oil, diesel fuel, aviation fuel, propane and gasoline);
- (13) Businesses providing mailing and shipping services, including post office boxes.
