





Title III - Wagner Peyser Services (employer services)

The services offered to employers, in addition to referral of job seekers to available job openings, include assistance in development of job order requirements, matching job seeker experience with job requirements, skills and other attributes, assisting employers with special recruitment needs, arranging for Job Fairs, assisting employers analyze hard-to-fill job orders, assisting with job restructuring and helping employers deal with layoffs (Rapid Response).



- FY 22/23 DWS & AE saw the largest co-enrollment numbers in our history and is one of the highest in the country.



Title I - WIOA Youth Program

Success Story - Evanston: Teyha Shine started the B.O.O.S.T. program at Uinta BOCES #1 in January 2023. She left high school after her sophomore year because she was extremely introverted, very shy, and bullied by fellow students. She was afraid to talk aloud at the beginning of B.O.O.S.T., but eventually started participating in group activities, class presentations, etc. Teyha had almost perfect attendance, earned her HSE, and many ready-to-work certifications. She is now working as a summer receptionist for our local Chamber of Commerce. She meets and greets residents and business owners, attends meetings, answers phones, and impresses her supervisor and co-workers with her willingness to excel and her sweet personality.



- WIN - 17 Participants, increasing outreach efforts
- POWER
- Dads Making a Difference (Last graduation was on July 11th. We are starting a new group September 11, 2023.





Workforce Center Programs & Services

TANF Programs - POWER Update

- We started group orientations in June 2023, the Cheyenne WFC sees an average of 3-6 participants, per orientation each week, and served approximately 80 participants in August
- POWER has served 237 participants in July statewide.
- Performance outcomes for POWER continue to exceed expectations. 70% of cases that closed in July closed due to wages.



Workforce Center Programs & Services

Career Compass Program

- We have more than 100 participants enrolled in the program
- We have begun utilizing the Premier Virtual Career Platform
- The Wi-Fi contract is completed and walk-throughs are beginning at the facilities
- Wi-Fi installation will start within the next month

RESEA Program


- Last quarter (Q2), 304 RESEA appointments were completed statewide. Of those, 48 participants or 16% of all participants have returned to gainful employment, and 4 entered into approved training programs that will lead to more gainful employment.
- We had a DOL technical assistance visit August 21-25 with Region IV representative Jarred Roope. Wyoming was given valuable insight and guidance and had the opportunity to ask several questions about RESEA procedures and the evaluation phase.

RESEA Conference - 45 attendees from all workforce centers. Two-day training held in Casper. Rolled out new policies and procedures and conducted a Resume upskilling workshop with guest presenter Ruth Pankratz from Gabby Communications. Mike Fazio, CEO of Workforce 180, also provided a keynote address and workshop highlighting how to help people find their motivation and empower them to return to work.
