## OTERO COLLEGE: STRATEGIC PLAN AY 23-24<sup>1</sup> SNAPSHOT & EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Otero showed a decline in the number of certificates and degrees awarded, with a 23.1% decrease over the previous year, falling behind the annual target of 1%. Fall-to-fall and fall-to-spring retention improved for full-time students, while decreasing for part-time students, but both populations remained below the national benchmarks of fall-to-fall retention rates. The part-time retention rate fell 7 percentage points, from 38.7% last year to 31.6% in AY 23-24.

The percentage of successful transfers to 4-year institutions has increased over the last two years, this year with an annual increase of 3.4 percentage points, slightly down from AY 22-23 (5.8 percentage points) but up from the AY 21-22 (-1.8 percentage points). In terms of concurrent enrollment metrics, Otero showed a decrease in credentials awards (-15.4%), but this decrease came after a substantial increase in AY 22-23. Credits earned through concurrent enrollment continued to decline (-7.7%) in AY23-24. Alternatively, matriculation of concurrent enrollment students observed a 2.5 percentage point increase, after AY 22-23 showed a 6.3 percentage point decline.

The three equity groups had mixed results in passing and completing gateway English and math courses. For gateway course completions in first year, some equity gaps observed an increase even as overall rates declined. For instance, students of color not only exceeded the overall rate but also observed an increase in gateway English course completion, gateway English pass rate, and gateway math completion. Whereas, first generation students were behind for all four metrics. The overall percentage of students experiencing a precipitous decline in GPA from first to second semester was 4.3% at OC, which was comparable to 4.1% for CCCS overall. In all three equity groups, students were more likely to experience a GPA decline. Similarly, transfer rates for all equity groups were behind that of the overall Otero population (36.7%).
