PIKES PEAK STATE COLLEGE: STRATEGIC PLAN AY 23-24¹ SNAPSHOT & EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In AY 23-24, PPSC fell short of all student success metric goals (Table 1.1). PPSC saw no growth in overall credential growth, compared to an increase of 4.4% for CCCS. While fall-to-fall retention rates didn't meet national averages, both fall-to-fall and fall-to-spring retention rates for full-time and part-time students saw an increase from last year. The percentage of students successfully transferred to four-year schools continued to rise in AY23-24, though it did not fully meet the 2-percentage points goal. Further, concurrent enrollment matriculation rate continued its downward trend, decreasing by 1.6 percentage points in AY 23-24. In contrast, the change in credentials awarded to concurrent enrollment students increased by 1.9% and credits earned by concurrent enrollment students also increased by 8.9%, exceeding the goal of 1%.

While equity indicators still show gaps, these gaps have narrowed in several areas or remained substantively small. In AY 22-23, students of color exceeded the full-time fall-to-fall retention rate for the overall population and in AY 23-24 fell just below the overall rate (55.1%). This shows a continued improvement for all equity groups except for first generation students, which declined slightly over the past year. Pass and completion rates for gateway English and math courses declined overall, with a significant decrease in math courses. The same decline was observed across all three equity groups. While the overall percentage of students enrolled at fall census but earning no credits stayed flat year over year (13.9%), Pell eligible students showed the most significant decline of 1.7 percentage points. All three equity groups fell short compared to PPSC overall for 4-year transfer rates, continuing a trend from the year prior. This trend has improved year over year overall and for all equity groups.
