## TRINIDAD STATE COLLEGE: STRATEGIC PLAN AY 23-24<sup>1</sup> SNAPSHOT & EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In AY 23-24, TSC met the majority of KPM goals pertaining to student outcomes. Certificates & degrees awarded increased year-over-year by 22.5% compared to the goal of 1% and compared to a 4.4% increase for CCCS as a whole. TSC retention rates continued to be strong, particularly compared to the trend for community colleges nationwide as they exceeded the national average for both full-time and part-time students. The overall full-time retention rate increased to 65.9% and students of color continued to narrow the gap, improving from 57.0% to 61.4%. Unlike fall-to-fall retention rates, fall-to-spring observed a mix result. Whereas full-time students' fall-to-spring retention had a 3.4 percentage points increase, part-time students' rate decreased by 7.3 percentage points. The transfer rate to 4-year institutions also declined by 3.0 percentage points. For concurrent enrollment metrics, TSC exceeded the 1% annual growth goal set for credits earned through concurrent enrollment (2.3%) and credentials awarded to concurrent enrollment students grew by 69.4%. Conversely, concurrent student matriculation rate declined by 1.3 percentage points, reversing last year's 1.6 percentage points increase.

Students of color and first-generation students fell a few percentage points behind the overall distance & hybrid courses pass rate and all-course pass rate. Across all three equality groups, first generation students demonstrated the lowest rates in completing gateway English and math, as well as passing gateway math courses in their first year. Alternatively, Pell eligible students remained higher than the overall rate. The overall percentage of students experiencing a precipitous decline in GPA from first to second semester increased from 1.0% to 2.6%, and the same result was shown across all three equity groups. First generation students continued to be the least likely of the equity groups to keep up with the overall transfer rate of 18.6%. The first-generation transfer rate came in at 12.8%. Students of color and Pell Eligible students also fell behind the overall rate; at 15.4% and 13.8% respectively.
