COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF AURORA: STRATEGIC PLAN AY 23-24¹ SNAPSHOT & EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In AY 23-24, CCA improved on many KPM metrics, with mixed results regarding their corresponding benchmarks. Fall-to-fall retention rates improved over last year for both full-time and part-time students, but the full-time rate remains below the national benchmark while part-time students exceed the national standard. The AY 23-24 results for concurrent enrollment show strong growth, with a 5.8% increase in credentials awarded and an 14.5% increase in credits earned. This compares to 2.9% and 18.8% for all CCCS, respectively. This was countered by a 1.7 percentage point drop in 4-year matriculation to CCCS by concurrent enrollment students, roughly in line with the overall CCCS drop of 1.6 percentage points.

The 4-year institution transfer rate decreased by 2.6 percentage points, against the goal of a 2-percentage point increase. Equity indicators show that students of color slightly exceeded the overall 4-year transfer rate (17.9% vs 17.7%), while first generation, and Pell eligible students trailed behind the overall average. While equity groups also trail the overall rates for full-time, fall-to-fall retention rates, part-time students of color and Pell eligible students had a higher fall-to fall retention rate than the overall student population.

Distance and hybrid courses remain well below the pass rate for on-campus courses at 69.5% vs. 85.6%. Students of color still fall slightly below the overall rate of students completing and passing gateway courses in their first year, while Pell eligible students exceeded these gateway course rates. However, the all-course pass rate (71.8%) and distance & hybrid course pass rate (66.7%) for Pell eligible students was much lower than the overall rate of 81.4% and 69.5%, respectively. The overall rate of precipitous decline in GPA from first to second semester rose from 4.7% last year to 5.6%. Equity groups showed higher rates of precipitous decline, especially Pell eligible and first-generation students.
