# **President's Updates**



## Day at the Capitol

On January 29, RRCC participated in Community College System Day at the Capitol, an event officially proclaimed by Governor Jared Polis to recognize the impact of Colorado's 13 community colleges. CCCS leaders, faculty, and students engaged with state legislators to discuss the importance of affordable, career-focused education and workforce development. # **Institutional Accomplishments**

#### **Enrollment Growth**

Red Rocks Spring 2025 enrollment has grown 9.6% over last year with 2,346 FTE. This is the largest spring enrollment we have had in over five years.

#### **Cyber Security Program**

HLC and the State of Colorado have approved RRCC's Cyber Security BAS program. Upper-level classes are available to students now via CCCS Online and promotions for fall enrollment will begin soon.

## **Business Administration Program**

HLC and the State of Colorado recently approved RRCC's Business Administration BAS program, creating new opportunities for students pursuing advanced business education and career advancement.

#### **Nursing**

The Board of Nursing has conditionally approved our Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN). We are in the midst of hiring faculty and will welcome our first nursing cohort at the Arvada campus in the Fall of 2025.

#### **New Grants**

\$1,219,365.00 Opportunity Now Aerospace Grant from the Office of Economic Development and International Trade (OEDIT) – to develop aerospace manufacturing curriculum and pathways.

\$58,540 Early Childhood Education (ECE) Skills Instructor Grant from the CCCS Foundation—which will connect ECE students to industry-based mentors to guide and enhance their education.


## **Student Community Resource Panel**
