The new PPSC Delta Dental Oral Health Career Center is now accepting patients for its Expanded Functions Dental Assisting Clinic. This clinic offers high-quality, affordable dental care to the community while providing students essential hands-on training.

These clinics are held in the college's state-of-the-art facility that opened in the summer of 2024, thanks to a historic \$2.5 million grant from the Delta Dental of Colorado Foundation (DDCOF).

This initiative provides affordable dental services while addressing the region's critical shortage of dental professionals. All treatments are performed by PPSC Dental Assisting students under the supervision of licensed dentists, ensuring safe and professional care. The clinic is open to PPSC students, staff, their families (including children 8 years and older), and the public. The clinic runs from Feb. 10 through May 7. Watch the story here.
