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#### Community College of Denver Recognized Nationally for Advancing Student Civic Engagement

Community College of Denver (CCD) has been named a 2024 **ALL IN Most Engaged Campus for College Student Voting**, a prestigious honor placing CCD among 471 colleges and universities nationwide recognized for their outstanding commitment to fostering student participation in democracy.

This national recognition reflects CCD's participation in the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge, a nonpartisan initiative aimed at increasing student voter engagement. Working in collaboration with Auraria Votes, CCD implemented a comprehensive engagement plan, complemented by insights from the National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE).

"Colleges and universities that make intentional efforts to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement have higher campus voter registration and voter turnout rates," said **Jennifer Domagal-Goldman**, Executive Director of the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge.

As part of its efforts, CCD encouraged students to make their voices heard during the historic 2024 election season. Through dynamic communications campaigns, the college motivated students to register, vote, and engage in civic life. Additionally, CCD provided vital post-election support by hosting **Post-Election Peace Spaces** on November 6 and 7.

These spaces offered a safe environment for the **CityHawk** community to process their emotions—whether joy, disappointment, or reflection—through calming activities like coloring and light refreshments. "We wanted to create a welcoming space where students could pause, process, and recharge after the election," explained **Associate Professor Tammi Spicer-Dormuth**.

CCD's ongoing dedication to civic engagement underscores its belief that every voice matters. By equipping students with the knowledge, resources, and emotional support needed for respectful democratic participation, CCD continues to shape informed and active citizens.

CCD held its inaugural **AI Governance Committee meeting** on Dec. 10, 2024. The meeting, co-led by **Peter Lindstrom**, Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs, and **Leisa Schievelbein**, Director of Information Technology, was open to all CCD faculty and staff, emphasizing the importance of inclusivity in this critical conversation.

During the meeting, participants reviewed the committee's **Scope Statement** and explored the evolving role of AI in education. The session also provided an opportunity to address questions and encourage broader involvement from faculty and staff as AI becomes increasingly integrated into academic and operational processes.

Looking ahead, the committee will focus on developing specific guidelines for faculty to reference throughout the spring semester, ensuring Al's application aligns with CCD's goals and values. Regular bi-monthly meetings have been scheduled to continue these discussions and provide a platform for ongoing collaboration and governance.

This first meeting marks an important step in CCD's efforts to thoughtfully integrate AI into its educational framework while fostering innovation and maintaining academic integrity.

# New Arts Degrees at CCD: Art Education and Industrial Design

This spring, CCD introduced two exciting new Arts degree programs: Art Education and Industrial Design. Developed in collaboration with Metropolitan State University of Denver (MSU), these programs feature special articulation agreements that create seamless transfer pathways to MSU. This partnership offers students inter-institutional opportunities and direct access to Colorado's only bachelor's program in Industrial Design, located on the Auraria Campus.

The launch of these degrees stems from a comprehensive program health assessment conducted by CCD in 2021. This in-depth review evaluated the vitality and relevance of existing programs, revealing that some Arts degrees did not align with high-wage, high-demand career opportunities. With extensive industry research and dedicated effort, CCD identified Industrial Design and Art Education as fields that meet both student and workforce needs. These programs equip students with the skills to pursue thriving careers in the Denver area's growing creative and industrial sectors.

By introducing these degrees, CCD continues to expand opportunities for students to achieve their academic and career goals while contributing to the economic and cultural vibrancy of the region.
