Be sure to stop by and take in the holiday cheer—it's the perfect way to get into the festive spirit at LCC!






LCC Writing Contest: Celebrate Love and History Through Words 🖍

This hands-on experience provides students with valuable knowledge in horse training, breeding, and industry connections. The semester ahead promises growth and learning for both students and horses alike!






LCC Stallion Auction a Success – Supporting Future Champions
