

ECONOMIC MOBILITY

Increase relevant offerings that will result in successful learners earning a sustaining wage.

Transfer Fair



RRCC hosted the Spring Transfer Fair, providing students with the opportunity to connect with advisors from colleges and universities across the region. This event supported students in exploring transfer pathways, academic programs, and scholarship opportunities, helping them navigate their transition to four-year institutions. To further encourage participation, students were eligible to win a \$500 voucher for meeting with advisors—offering additional support for future graduates as they plan their next steps in higher education. Through initiatives like the Transfer Fair, RRCC remains dedicated to expanding resources that empower students in their academic and career pursuits.

New Bachelor Degrees

RRCC has been approved to offer a Bachelor of Science for Business Administration and a Bachelor of Science for Sonography. Both programs start in the fall of 2025.

Associate Degree in Nursing

RRCC received approval from the State Board of Nursing in March and will welcome an initial cohort of 24 students this fall.

Foundation Scholarships

RRCC received over 550 applications for RRCC Foundation scholarships, demonstrating strong student demand for financial support. These scholarships, which range from \$500 to \$5,000, provide critical funding to help students reduce financial barriers and pursue their educational goals. The average award amount of \$2,000 underscores RRCC's commitment to enhancing access to higher education and supporting student success through targeted financial assistance.

It Takes a Village

During the 2023-2024 School Year, the Child Care Access Means Parents in Schools grant (CCAMPIS) helped to fund childcare for ten RRRC student parents. Seven of the ten student parents graduated during the 23-24 year with three more student parents graduating this past December. For the first time in the history of the program, all of the student parents graduated, and their average GPA was 3.37. RRCC is so proud of these student parents and the staff of the Children's Center at Red Rocks Community College who made it possible for the students to meet their education goals.

Mental Health Academy Speaker

The Mental Health Academy recently hosted a guest speaker event with Kerri Reifel, who provided an exclusive insight into the world of FBI criminal profiling. Students gained a deeper understanding of the psychological and investigative techniques used to analyze criminal behavior. During the event, Reifel shared her experiences, insights, and expertise, offering valuable perspectives on psychology, law enforcement, and forensic investigation.



Empty Bowls Fundraiser: RRCC Food Pantry & Canned Food



The Ceramics Department hosted its second annual Empty Bowls Fundraiser in support of the RRCC Student Pantry, bringing together students, faculty, and staff for a meaningful cause. Students from Ceramics 1-4 and Studio Art crafted and sold handmade bowls, with 100% of the proceeds donated to the RRCC Food Bank. Each bowl purchase was accompanied by a scoop of Little Man Ice Cream.

Beyond the bowl sales, the event also served as a donation drive, collecting canned foods and hygiene products to further support students in need. Held on the bridge from March 4-5, the fundraiser was a tremendous success, **raising \$3,700 for the food bank.** This event showcases the generosity and community spirit of RRCC, reinforcing our commitment to supporting student well-being through creative and collaborative initiatives.

With grant awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$250,000, the fund aims to support initiatives that:

CO Online

RRCC continues to robustly support CO Online, including volunteering to teach the pooled online sections. Below is a snapshot of RRCC's instructor and student participation in CO Online for Spring of 2025:

- 120 RRCC instructors taught 2,813 CCCS unduplicated students and 4,217 duplicated students in CO Online Courses.
- 7 RRCC faculty taught a course with no RRCC students.
- 1,644 unduplicated RRCC students took one or more CO Online Courses.
- 842 of RRCC students (unduplicated) were taught by an RRCC online instructor.
 802 RRCC online students (unduplicated) were taught by instructors from other CCCS institutions.
