

Expanded Offerings for Fall 2025



PPSC is offering three new degree programs this fall, including two bridge programs for students who are Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) to become Registered Nurses (RN), and a Paramedic to RN bridge program.

"These bridge programs allow students to build upon their existing skills and transition into higher-level nursing roles efficiently," says Carmen Luttrell, director of nursing education practices at PPSC. "With Colorado facing significant healthcare staffing shortages, these programs provide a much-needed solution to help fill critical roles while offering career advancement opportunities for students already in the field."

The college will also begin its Bachelor of Science degree in Business, which includes internship opportunities, along with partnerships within the region's business community to help provide hands-on learning experiences.

"This degree is designed for students who want to take their careers to the next level—whether they're aiming for management positions, starting their own business, or pursuing specialized business fields," says Dr. Carol Kurkowski, co-department chair of the business department at PPSC. "By offering this program at an affordable cost, we're making a four-year business degree more accessible to students in the Pikes Peak Region."



PPSC Nursing Best in the State



PPSC was named the #1 Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program in the state by the Board of Nursing, following another outstanding 100% pass rate on the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX).

This prestigious ranking places PPSC at the top among 722 ADN programs across the country and solidifies its reputation as a leader in nursing education.

The ranking is based on NCLEX pass rates, program quality, and student success outcomes, demonstrating PPSC's commitment to excellence in nursing education.

With Colorado facing a significant nursing shortage, PPSC continues to provide highly skilled and workforce-ready nurses to fill critical healthcare roles in the community.

"This recognition is a direct result of our dedicated faculty, rigorous curriculum, and the passion our students bring to the program," says Carmen Luttrell, director of nursing education practices. "Our goal is not just to prepare students for the NCLEX, but to also equip them with the critical thinking, hands-on experience, and confidence needed to be exceptional caregivers in a demanding field."

PPSC's high-tech simulation labs, strong clinical partnerships, and focus on real-world experience contribute to the program's success. Nursing students receive hands-on training through clinical rotations at leading healthcare facilities in the region, ensuring they are well-prepared to transition from classroom learning to professional practice.

New Short-term Intensive Courses

The PPSC Downtown Campus is piloting a new short-term intensive class format. The campus will offer PSY 1016, Stress Management, from April 28 – May 9, at 6 – 8 p.m. Taught by PPSC Associate Dean Misty Hull, the course is offered both in-person and hyflex. If the pilot goes well, the Downtown Campus hopes to offer this course once a month. Employees can take advantage of Tuition Reimbursement or Tuition Assistance for this course.
