The Northeastern Nursing/EMT/Fire Science programs participated in a Mass Casualty Incident Training on March 10.





This year, a simulated chemical leak required the Fire and EMS students to evacuate patients from multiple floors and transport them to the nursing lab where our nursing students conducted initial triage under the guidance of physicians from the Sterling Community Hospital. Sterling Police Department and Sterling Fire Department supported the event, including the arrival of the medivac helicopter based in Sterling. This community-wide event exposes our students to an actual emergency so they can employ the skills they have learned.
