This allows teachers and staff to focus on the learning experience. Cariina acts as an "organizational management software" (OMS) to standardize and streamline processes across the organization.
- The main benefits of Cariina's OMS are:
 1) Standardization and centralization of processes and knowledge,
 2) Tying institutional knowledge to the organization rather than individuals, and

3) Flexibility and scalability to adapt as the school changes.
