6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments including whether the rule implements a state statute for the first time:

The Executive Director of the Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC) is proposing to readopt with amendments Plc 1002, Application Processing, Examination, Initial Inspection, and Licensing Fees Specific To Each Profession, with amendments to:

- Delete "Examination" and "Initial Inspection" from the heading, to reflect that those fees are no longer in Plc 1002;
- Revise the fee tables to reflect a 10% increase to better meet the requirement in RSA 310:5, I for fees to "be sufficient to produce estimated revenues up to 125 percent of the total operating expenses for the office, as determined by averaging the operating expenses for the office for the previous 2 fiscal years";
- Revise the fee tables to equalize the application fees for initial and renewal applications;
- Remove fees for inspections required for initial licensure, as they are being added to Plc 1001 in a separate rulemaking;
- Remove fees for examinations, as they are covered by Plc 313.03 now that the OPLC no longer directly administers any examinations;
- Add fee tables for the State Board of Auctioneers, the Boxing and Wrestling Commission, Voluntary Certification of Community Health Workers, Voluntary Certification of Doulas and Lactation Support Providers, Registration of Nurse Agencies, and Registration of Professional Bondsmen; and
- Correct and adjust the existing language as needed.

The Executive Director met or corresponded with each board to discuss fees and options available for the calculations over the course of several months in calendar year 2024.

6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

The proposed rules will affect any individual who holds or wishes to hold a license to practice a regulated profession and any business organization that holds or wishes to hold a certificate of authority to practice a regulated profession.

1. Comparison of the costs of the proposed rule(s) to the existing rule(s):

When compared to the existing rules the proposed rules will increase state revenue, increase costs to certain citizens of the state and to certain independently owned businesses. Not applicable to Plc 1002.52 through Plc 1002.56 which are new sections.

2. Cite the Federal mandate. Identify the impact on state funds:

No federal mandate, no impact on state funds.

3. Cost and benefits of the proposed rule(s):

The Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC) states the proposed rules revise the fee tables to reflect amounts that better meet the requirement in RSA 310:5, I for fees to "be sufficient to produce estimated revenues up to 125 percent of the total operating expenses for the office. Fees for inspections for initial licensure and fees for examinations being deleted as they are addressed in other rules (Plc 1001 and Plc 313.03). The OPLC provided a detailed comparison of the proposed fees to the existing fees for initial and renewal applications. This comparison includes an estimate of the number of each application/fee received in a 24-month period multiplied by the change in each fee to arrive at an estimate of the dollar impact of each change over a 24-month period. This detailed comparison is included as an attachment to this

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fiscal impact statement and is a document provided by the OPLC. The OPLC states the proposed fees are a 10% increase and the proposed rules will result in an estimated net increase in fees paid by licensees and fee revenue received by the OPLC Fund of approximately \$2.5 million over a biennium.

The OPLC does not have information on the number of licenses or renewals for boxing and wrestling managers, doulas and lactation support providers, nurse agencies or professional bondsman.

A. To State general or State special funds:

There will be no cost or benefit to the state General Fund. Biennial revenue to the OPLC fund will increase by approximately \$2.5 million as described in #3 above.

B. To State citizens and political subdivisions:

Citizens of the state who are licensed professionals or who wish to be become licensed in these professions will experience a cost increase. There will be no fiscal impact on political subdivisions.

C. To independently owned businesses:

Independently owned businesses that hold a certificate of authority or that wish to obtain a certificate of authority will experience a cost increase.

The rules do not apply to political subdivisions. The rules thus do not mandate or assign any new, expanded, or modified programs or responsibilities to any political subdivision in such a way as to necessitate additional local expenditures and so do not violate Part I, Article 28-a of the N.H. Constitution.
