

During a Middle States accreditation visit, the evaluation team could provide three types of feedback based on their assessment of the institution's compliance with accreditation standards:

1. **Collegial Advice** – Informal suggestions aimed at strengthening the institution's practices, but these are not binding. They are offered as constructive feedback based on the team's expertise and observations. The institution is not required to act on collegial advice, but it may be beneficial.
2. **Recommendations** – More formal documentation may be requested when an institution appears in compliance but oversight is needed to provide additional information. Middle States may request that the institution respond to recommendations in future narrative responses.
3. **Requirements** – Mandatory corrective actions that signal non-compliance with a Middle States standard. Requirements are serious and must be addressed promptly to avoid potential accreditation consequences, including warnings, probation, or loss of accreditation. This could include a follow-up report and potentially an additional visit.
