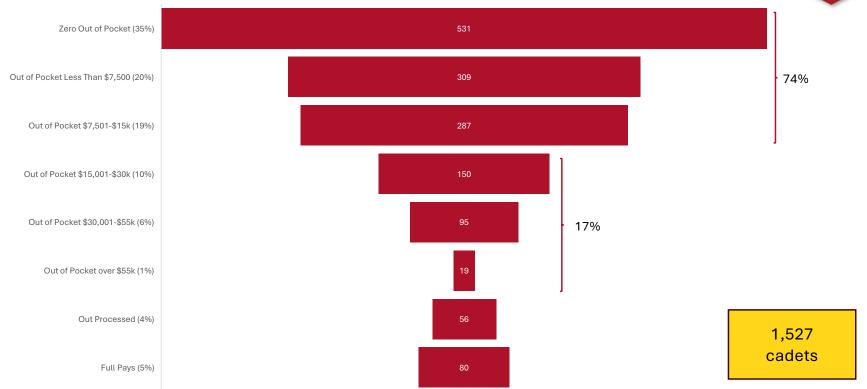

Annual Out-of-Pocket Cost





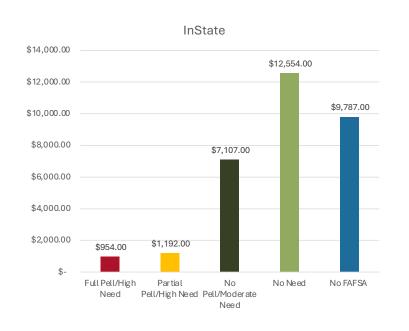

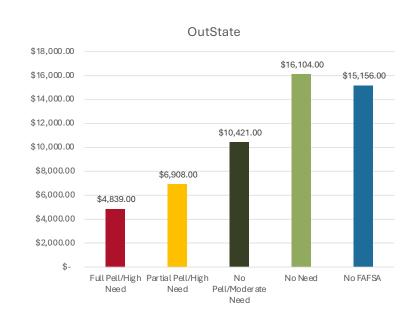

Annual Average Amount Out of Pocket After Aid by SAI

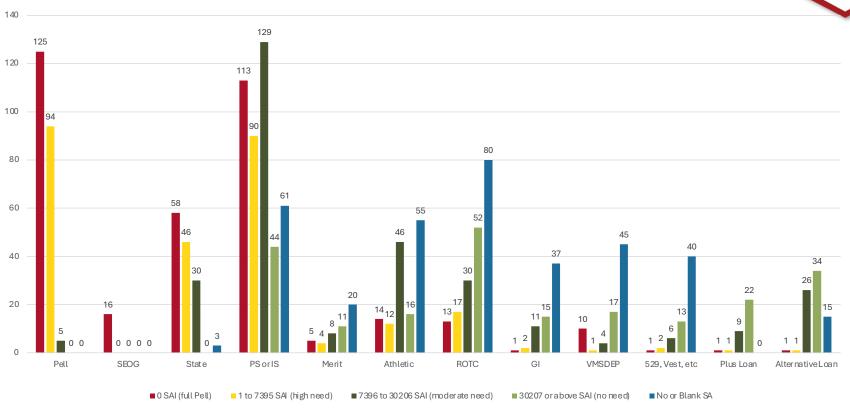






In-State Aid Bucket by SAI

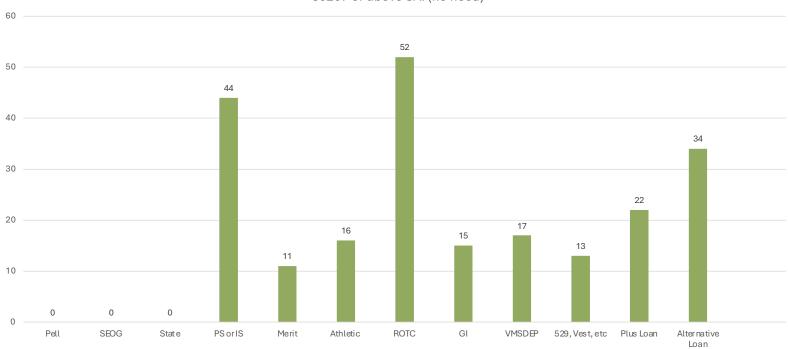






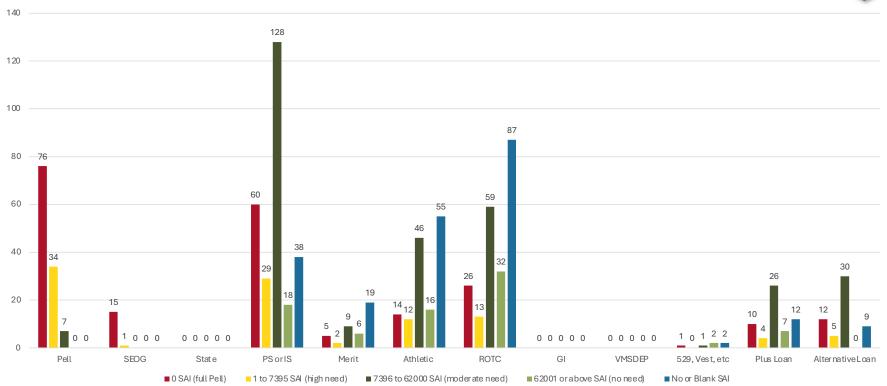






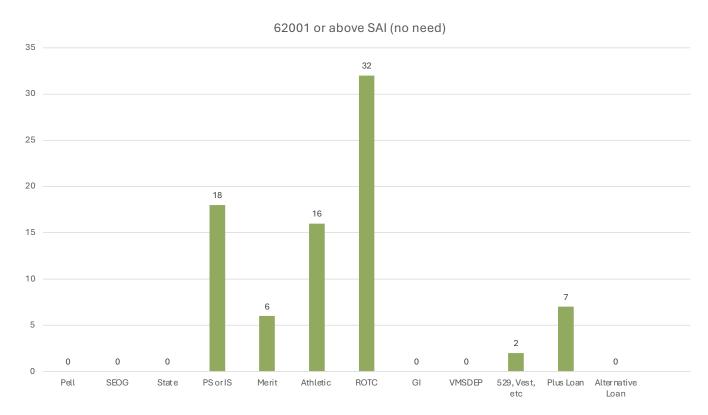
Out-of-State Aid Bucket by SAI

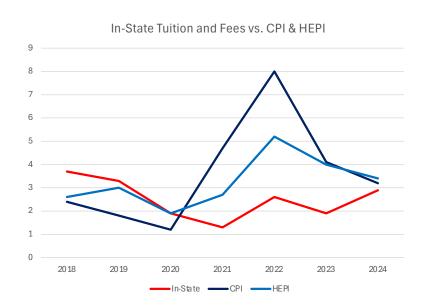


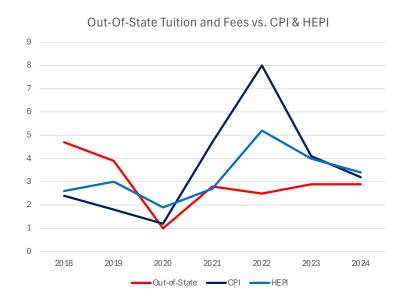
- Salaries for full-time employees and adjunct faculty are projected to increase by 3% in FY 2026.
- VMI share of the health insurance cost will increase 6.0% in FY 2026.
- Employee share of health insurance cost will also increase 6.0% in FY 2026.
- Utilities, Contractual Spending (ex. IT, transportation)
- Implementation of Forging 21st Century Leaders

EDUCATION & GENERAL

Funds set aside for core academic programs and support services.

Examples: Instruction, student services, libraries, administration, facility maintenance

Total E&G \$78.2M

AUXILIARY

Funds that support services provided to cadets, faculty, and staff for a fee. Auxiliary enterprises are self-supporting units that provide goods and services.

Examples: Athletics, Dining Services, Parking, Bookstore, Activities

Total Auxiliary \$34.9M

UNIQUE MILITARY ACTIVITIES

Funds that support the unique military activities at VMI, Virginia Tech, and Mary Baldwin. Funded partially by the State and partially from Cadet UMA Fee.

Examples: ROTC Programs, Military Store, Laundry, Tailor Shop, certain functions of the Commandants Office

<u>0% Tuition Increase</u>

- Additional state funding for VMSDEP & Higher Education System request may result in additional revenue to offset new cost increases.
- With no new state funding to offset expenses the use of saved E&G surplus funds from previous budgets (fund balance) will be employed or reduction to operations.

2.5% Tuition Increase

• Revenue generated from this option covers operating costs and balances the operating budget.

Summary: Affordability and Tuition and Fees



- VMI's commitment to affordability results in more than 86% of the Corps of Cadets receiving some sort of financial aid.
- The availability of financial aid funding from all sources (Federal, State, VMI, private) results in financial aid packaging to match each cadets financial situation.
- Fiscal discipline has allowed VMI to weather COVID and the recent enrollment decline while avoiding the use of the fund balance to sustain E&G operations.
- In FY 2026, VMI can hold tuition flat if the State provides additional funding or the E&G fund balance is budgeted to assist with increased required costs.
