

Student enrollment in graduate level Native American Leadership programs and emphases has been historically steady but increased significantly in the 2023-24 academic year. Enrollment in the MS Native American Leadership program, and Native American Leadership emphases within other SE graduate programs consistently averaged 69 students (range of 65-72) in the fall and spring semesters from 2021-2023. And enrollment in graduate programs with a Native American Leadership / Native American Populations emphases increased 23% (to 86) enrolled students in the fall and 32% (to 91) in spring of 2024. Furthermore, the effective management of Health Information Systems is a critical skill in Native American healthcare organizations and healthcare providers serving Native American populations. 
