# SUMMARY

NSU requests formal approval from RUSO to offer lower-level courses leading to bachelor's degrees at the NSU-BA campus. This change will allow NSU to help meet not only the region's workforce but also over fifty of the critical occupations for the state of Oklahoma.

## BACKGROUND

The city of Broken Arrow, as well as the greater Tulsa metropolitan area, needs a public, fouryear institution of higher education. As you deliberate this request, please consider the following key points.

<u>Financial Commitment</u>: The City of BA has already invested \$43 million for the NSU-BA campus with the understanding that it would be a four-year university.

<u>Population Growth</u>: The population of BA has increased by 50,000 since the 1990's and is expected to double by 2060. It is on track to be the third largest city in OK.

<u>Economic Development</u>: In the last year alone, 1,000 new jobs were added to the workforce as well as \$100 million in new capital investments. This growing economy requires an educated workforce.

<u>Young People</u>: High school graduates lack a choice for a traditional four-year public university in the city of BA. In addition, 7,000 BA students are ineligible for Tulsa Achieves, a scholarship program that pays for up to 100% of tuition and fees for graduating high school seniors to attend Tulsa Community College.

## **10 YEAR PLAN**

NSU has developed both short- and long-term plans for growth of the NSU-BA campus, consisting of both academic and student life goals.

## <u>1 Year Plan</u>

ACADEMIC LIFE

- Offer key lower-level general education courses
- Initiate market analysis for future programs with emphasis on state critical occupations and local workforce needs
- Build partnerships with surrounding business partners

### STUDENT LIFE

- Plan on-campus student activities and events
- Add Esports and Disc Golf as club sports
- Play one home football game at Broken Arrow High School

### 5 Year Plan

ACADEMIC LIFE

- Offer full general education curriculum
- Start new majors based on market analysis performed in year one
- Provide experiential learning opportunities for every student

### STUDENT LIFE

- Increase services such as student engagement, counseling, disability services, and advising
- Build multi-purpose recreation center for sports and fitness
- Offer NCAA Women's DII Volleyball and Men's and Women's Wrestling

## <u>10 Year Plan</u>

ACADEMIC LIFE

- Refine course and major options based on market needs
- Evaluate current offerings based on headcount and credit hour production to date
- Continue to forge new partnerships to meet local workforce needs

#### STUDENT LIFE

- Build dormitory or apartments for student housing
- Provide additional on-campus food options
- Explore new DII sports and campus events to meet student needs

### PROPOSAL

We request formal approval from RUSO to offer lower-level courses leading to bachelor's degrees at the NSU-BA campus. As you see in the previous section, our first goal is to begin offering key lower-level general education courses, and Academic Affairs has developed a plan to do this. These classes will be taught by NSU faculty, either full-time or adjunct, and will be offered in-person on our campus in BA. Depending on demand, these courses may be phased in over time.
