I'm writing to the board to request a waiver for rule MHP 305.03 (b):

I am currently receiving supervision from a board certified and approved supervisor. I am seeking supervision hours from September 2018 through August 2020 to be approved as they will fall outside of the 24-month period which is normally required.

- 1) In regard to adherence to the rule that would cause hardship, not being about to utilize the hours accumulated during said period would cause me hardship due to significantly delaying my timeline to become licensed. This could impact my ability to fulfill my current job as well as future opportunities.
- 2) This requested waiver is necessary because the gaps between supervisors were caused by job changes as well as supervisor changes which were beyond my control.
