Recommendation that the Broward College District Board of Trustees authorize a standard agreement (purchase order) with Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture (ACSA) for membership dues and renewal for FY2024-FY2025 (Visual & Performing Arts). Fiscal Impact: \$808.00

What is the purpose of this contract and why is it needed? ACSA (Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture) Membership. As full member institution, Broward College through ACSA provides professional development and networking organization for Florida's Architecture courses for Architecture AS programs. This is an annual, institutional membership fee. Students and faculty interact with other member organizations and firms to network, intern and develop job opportunities for our graduates. Positively impacts 261 architecture students.

What procurement process or bid waiver was used and why? Small purchase for Category One (\$0.00 - \$10,000) per College Procedure A6Hx2-6.34 was used, where there are no formal or informal competitive requirements for goods and services acquired by the College at this dollar threshold. Membership dues, per the Florida Statute 119.01(3) requires that all financial, business and membership records held by the organization in relation to the individual(s) or organization(s) for whom a purchase order is being issued are to be considered public records and shall be subject to the provisions of Florida Statute 119.07.

Is this a budgeted expenditure from the budget established at the last June Board of Trustees meeting? Yes.

What fund, cost center and line item(s) were used? FD100, CC0575, GLC: 64502:Inst. Memberships and Sponsorships.

Has Broward College used this vendor before for these products or services? Yes (through a purchase order).

Was the product or service acceptable in the past? Yes.

Was there a return on investment anticipated when entering this contract? Yes.

Was that return on investment not met, met, or exceeded and how? Return on investment met as department faculty and students gained access to ACSA lectures, meetings and webinars statewide.

Does this directly or indirectly feed one of the Social Enterprise tactics and how? Directly feeds the student empowerment and development Social Enterprise tactic by ensuring teaching and programmatic excellence - to provide a best in class learning environment for our students.

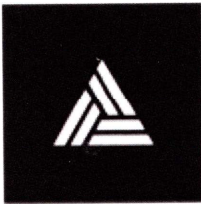

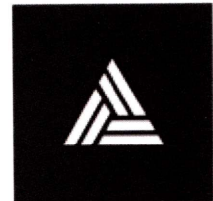
