## SPRING 2025 ENROLLMENT

- **Enrollment increase of 4% in headcount and .3% in credit hours compared to Spring 2024.**
- **Increases occurred in:**
  - +172 early college students which equaled +940 credit hours
  - +92 non-degree seeking students which equaled +59 credit hours
  - +5 first-time freshman students which equaled +6 credit hours
- **Decreases occurred in:**
  - -51 continuing students which equaled -671 credit hours
  - -10 transfer students which equaled -79 credit hours
  - -9 returning students which equaled -143 credit hours

## NATIONAL TRENDS

- Freshmen enrollment grew 5.5% this fall. Growth was strongest at community colleges, adding 63,000 freshmen (+7.1%). Overall, 18-year-old freshmen also saw enrollment gains this fall (+3.4%, +59,000).
- Public 2-year institutions with vocational program focus saw double-digit growth for the second year in a row. These schools now encompass 19.5 percent of public 2-year enrollment, up from 15.3 percent in 2019.
- Students 25 and older are growing at a faster rate than 18 to 20 and 21- to 24-year-olds. (25-29: +6.1%, 30 and older: +6.8%)
