WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

CUSTOMIZED TRAINING AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Northeast Community College realizes in today's competitive labor market, organizations must maximize opportunities. The Workforce Development department partners with area businesses to customize training to expand the capacity of their staff. In 2023-2024, 785 employees in Northeast Nebraska and the surrounding area were upskilled through customized training. Leadership development continues to be one of the most requested areas for training which focuses on building strong leaders who can lead engaged teams. These programs often utilize behavioral assessments to gain insight into natural behavioral preferences. The most requested topics include communication, conflict management, accountability, strategic planning, and teambuilding.

IHUB

IHub is part of a collaborative effort to position Nebraska as a national leader in automation and robotic technologies. iHub will offer a facility geared to empower learners as young as 4th grade through adulthood to explore diverse career pathways, engage in hands-on STEAM education, and gain industry-recognized credentials. It will also house a mobile training in robotics, industrial automation, and electromechanical programs to meet the workforce demands of local manufacturers and the agriculture sector.

APPRENTICESHIP

There are currently 10 apprenticeship programs ranging from accounting to information technology, diesel technology, chemical application, welding, and more. The financial return for employers averages around \$1.40 for every dollar spent.

PLC/MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN TRAINING

This upskilling prepares current technicians to improve troubleshooting skills, unnecessary parts replacement, and a reduction in production down-time in the 13,000 manufacturing jobs and 7,700 food production jobs within the Northeast Community College service area.

Impacting our region's economy

Northeast not only contributes to the workforce through our skilled graduates and training programs, our regional economic impact is substantial to the northeast region of Nebraska. In a study conducted by EMSI | burning glass in 2022, it was found that Northeast's added value is equal to 2.3% of the region's total gross regional product (GRP). The study also showed that the activities of Northeast and its students support one out of every 34 jobs in the Northeast service area.

OPERATIONS SPENDING IMPACT

Northeast employed 543 full-time and part-time faculty and staff. Payroll amounted to \$39 million, much of which was spent in the region for groceries, mortgage and rent

payments, dining out, and other household expenses. The college spent another \$18.3 million on day-to-day expenses related to facilities, supplies, and professional services. The net impact of the college's operations spending added \$41.7 million in income to the regional economy in FY 2020-21.

STUDENT SPENDING IMPACT

Around 35% of credit students attending Northeast originated from outside the region. Some of these students relocated to the Northeast service area. In addition, some in-region students, referred to as retained students, would have left the Northeast service area for other educational opportunities if not for Northeast. These relocated and retained students spent money on groceries, mortgage

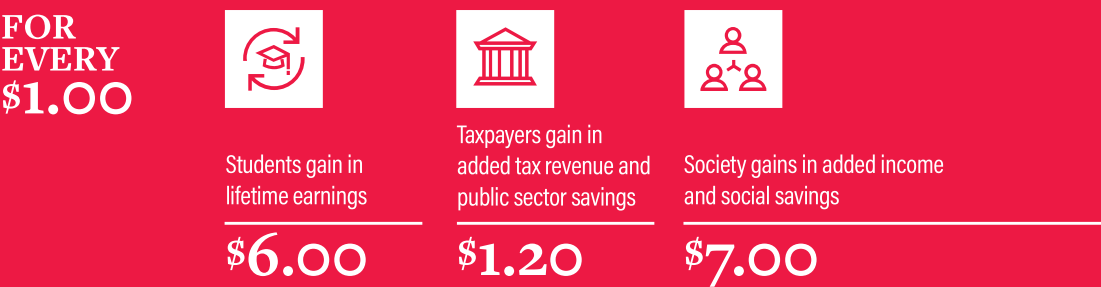
and rent payments, and other living expenses at regional businesses. The expenditures of relocated and retained students in FY 2020-21 added \$3.4 million in income to the Northeast service area economy.

ALUMNI IMPACT

Over the years, students have studied at Northeast and entered or re-entered the workforce with newly acquired knowledge and skills. Today, thousands of these former students are employed in the Northeast service area. The net impact of Northeast's former students currently employed in the regional workforce amounted to \$181.7 million in added income in FY 2020-21.

Northeast Community College creates a significant positive impact on the business community and generates a return on investment to its major stakeholder groups—students, taxpayers, and society. Using a two-pronged approach that involves an economic impact analysis and an investment analysis, this study calculates the benefits received by each of these groups. Results of the analysis reflect fiscal year (FY) 2020-21. This analysis was developed by EMSI | burning glass in 2022.

INVESTMENT ANALYSIS

STUDENT PERSPECTIVE

Northeast's FY 2020-21 students paid a present value of \$8.4 million to cover the cost of tuition, fees, supplies, and interest on student loans. They also forewent \$27.2 million in money that they would have earned had they been working instead of attending college. In return for their investment, students will receive a cumulative present value \$215.2 million in increased earnings over their working lives. This translates to a return of \$6.00 in higher future earnings for every dollar students invest in their education. Students' average annual rate of return is 27.9%.

TAXPAYER PERSPECTIVE

Taxpayers provided Northeast Community College with \$47 million of funding in FY 2020-21. In return, they will benefit from added tax revenue, stemming from students' higher lifetime earnings and increased business output, amounting to \$50.4 million. A reduced demand for government-funded services in Nebraska will add another \$4.1 million in benefits to taxpayers. The average annual rate of return for taxpayers is 0.6%.

SOCIAL PERSPECTIVE

In FY 2020-21, Nebraska invested \$88.4 million to support Northeast. In turn, the Nebraska economy will grow by \$604.9 million, over the course of students' working lives. Society will also benefit from \$11.8 million of public and private sector savings. For every dollar invested in Northeast in FY 2020-21, people in Nebraska will receive \$7.00 in return, for as long as Northeast's FY 2020-21 students remain active in the state workforce.

enVISION Strategic Plan

In May 2021, the enVISION Strategic Plan was revealed highlighting the onset of a journey toward guided pathways transformation.

This plan builds upon the foundation set by the previous plan, reinforces the college mission, defines its vision, articulates its values, establishes priorities, and provides systems for every depart-

ment to identify clear goals and objectives. The strategic priorities are rooted in past accomplishments and desired future direction to become a more student-ready institution.

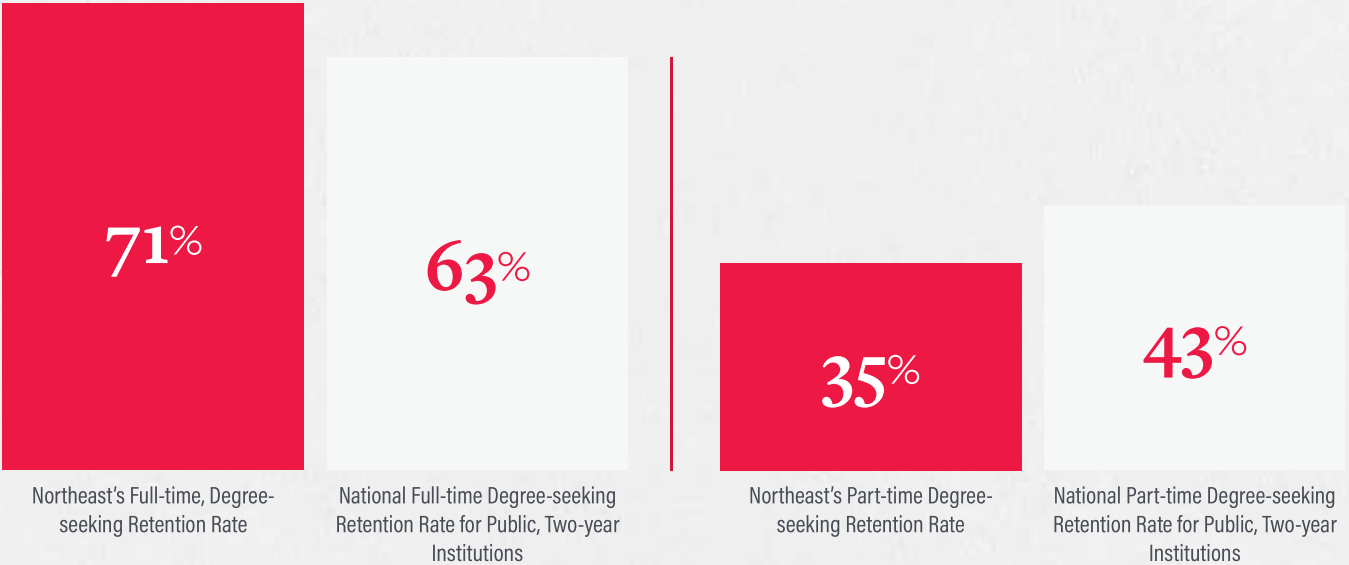

Sixty-six Northeast student-athletes were named to various National Junior College Athletic Association All-Academic teams for their work in the classroom this year.

AGREEMENT WITH USDA TO STRENGTHEN RURAL WORKFORCE

Northeast is partnering with USDA Rural Development through the Community College Alliance for Agriculture Advancement (C2A3) to support rural workforce development. A memorandum of understanding (MOU) was signed to provide Midwest students with resources and skills to advance careers in agriculture and rural economic development.

FIRST WORKFORCE PIPELINE SUMMIT

Northeast co-sponsored the first ELEVATE Summit, featuring speakers on building a skilled workforce through work-based learning, including apprenticeships, high school training, and tapping into diverse talent pools.

IHUB GROUNDBREAKING

The groundbreaking for the iHub facility in downtown Norfolk took place. iHub will partner with employers on fabrication and workforce training, while offering space for community collaboration and youth education.

MACLAY CONSTRUCTION

The MacLay Building is being replaced with a modern facility that meets technological and ADA requirements. It will house academic programs from Accounting to Health Information Management, along with Adult Education and Academic Outreach.

NATIONAL SKILLSUSA CHAMPIONSHIP

Northeast's Teamworks SkillsUSA team won the gold medal at the national competition. The team consists of four members, two from building construction, one from electrical construction and control and one from plumbing. This is the second year that Northeast has taken the gold.



NEW LOGOS UNVEILED

Northeast unveiled new institutional and athletics logos, reflecting its status as one of the nation's top community colleges and its commitment to growth and progress and helping students and the region move onward and upward.

PARAMEDIC STUDENT HONORED FOR SAVING LIFE

Northeast paramedic student, Eric Kloster, was honored with the State of Nebraska's CODE Save Award. During his internship, Kloster used his training from Northeast to help save a patient who had been down for seven minutes before CPR began. The patient's heart was defibrillated 48 times over an extended period. Some 48 hours later, the patient walked out of the hospital on his own accord and was able to go home and continue his life.

RECORD NUMBER OF EMPLOYERS SEEK NORTHEAST STUDENTS AT CAREER FAIR

More than 100 employers with jobs that are located locally, regionally, and nationally attended the Spring Career Fair at Northeast. The employers represented Agriculture, Skilled Trades, Criminal Justice, Manufacturing, and more. The Spring Career Fair is one of several recruiting events that Northeast hosts for students and graduates.

SOUTH SIOUX CITY EXPANSION

Federal funds were used to expand the South Sioux City campus to help address local workforce needs, adding a CDL training facility, a truck driving range, and expanding the Industrial Training building to increase capacity of the welding program.

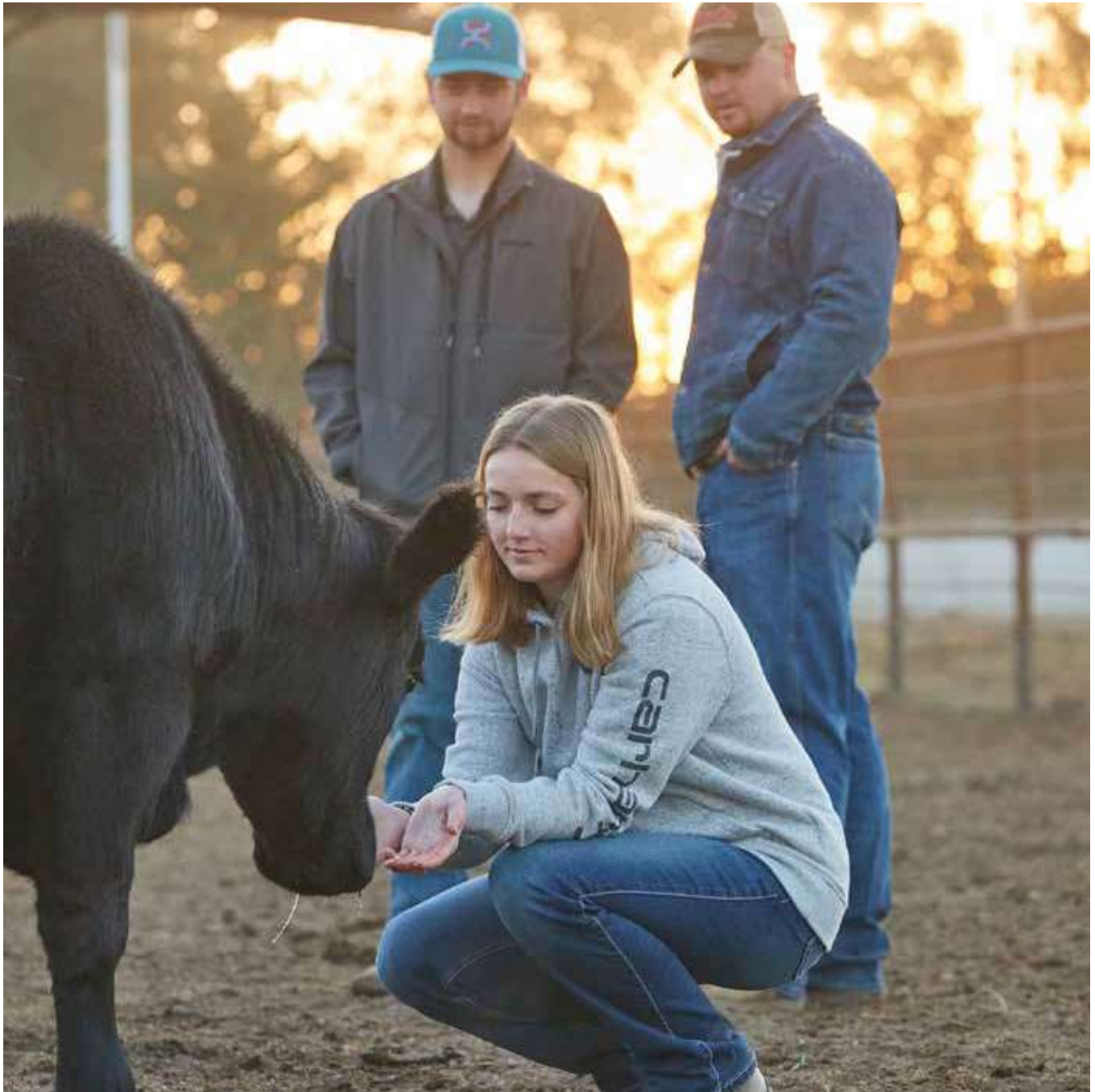
TECHNOLOGY AWARD AND MORE THAN \$1 MILLION IN SAVINGS EXPECTED

 - Computer room for printing application materials and conducting job search.
 - Offer lifetime employment assistance to alumni at no charge.
