Our Statutory Purpose (Nebraska Revised Statute 85-962)

- Foundational education (English language learning (ELL), high school equivalency (GED), developmental education)
- Public service, continuing education, and personal development training

- Applied research - hands-on experiential learning to enhance teaching and learning, public service and professional development
