Petition 22-PC-66 was held over as an ordinance at the County Board in February to be voted on in March. The Petition went overlooked and will be on the County Board for vote in May.

The Renewable Energy Committee voted to extend the moratorium on wind, solar and battery storage until September 1, 2022.

The Pipeline Survey results are in and the Renewable Energy Committee will be reviewing the draft pipeline ordinance.

The Wind, Solar, and Battery Storage Survey went out this weekend. The results of that survey will be compiled in three weeks for the Renewable Energy Committee to evaluate.

The Zoning Office had sent nine (9) inoperable vehicle letters out in April. (Certified - \$130) Four property owners are repeat offenders from past years.

The Zoning Office has processed forty-three (43) building permits for the month of April. Total collected \$5,131.95.
